EDITORIAL

This issue is effectively our summer issue of The Tower - "Summer?" you might be thinking, "It's been more like April than Flaming June". But hey, hopefully there will soon be endless sunshine with warm sunny days.

It was a real pleasure to see the bunting strung throughout the village in readiness for the celebration of Her Majesty The Queen's 90th Birthday celebrations and for those of us who attended the festivities behind the village, it can truly be said that 'A good time was had by one and all'. On behalf of us all, a very big "Thank you" to all of those who worked so hard to bring about this fabulous event. It was so good to see the village coming together in this way.

The river is a tremendous asset to the village and the river bank is looking good at the moment - thanks to The Tidy Group for their continued efforts. Bank reinforcing work using the coir rolls has started to knit in and those that were pre-planted are growing well. It is nice to see that we now have two narrow boats moored in the village and that people are using the river more for boating recreation. Hopefully if the water levels are kept up, an increase in boat traffic will prevent weed from strangling the river during the summer months. The building of the water access point near the Kingfisher Memorial is still planned and awaiting grant money to be released.

We note that The Dog Warden has issued someone in the village with a fixed penalty fine. In one sense, it is surprising that this has happened after all of the publicity that has been put in this magazine about carrying 'poop bags' and 'picking up' as well as the many notices that are posted around the village, but then again, it just shows that there are some people who will only comply if they get caught and then suffer a financial penalty. Hopefully everyone will realise that it is socially unacceptable not to be prepared for and to clean up after your dog and that if you do not, then a fine is highly likely.

Contained within this issue is a newsletter about the proposed wind farm at East Heckington. We certainly hope that the work that has gone in to fighting the revised planning application will cause Ecotricity to think again about the whole project, admit defeat and withdraw altogether. In the meantime, the fight goes on.

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

As I write this slightly shorter update, the ramifications of the EU referendum result are only slowly sinking in and may take weeks to assimilate fully, however, my over-riding feeling is one of hope for a new and self-determined future without the encumbrance of the EU and one which has gone a long way to restoring most of my faith in the democratic process. Enough said. The Parish Council meanwhile continues to beaver away in the background, albeit with a slightly modified team, with Councillor Micky Clark stepping into the role of Vice-Chair (at the AGM 19 May), taking over from from Cllr Peter Goode whom we all thank for his efforts as Vice Chairman.

To update you on some issues: You may be aware of the LCC withdrawal of the amenity grass cutting subsidy next year but fortunately the District Council have now notified us of their intent to continue cutting the grass opposite Brownlow Close. As regards Highways, the meeting on 15 June with Mr Rowan Smith (LCC Highways Manager) was very informative and we have subsequently written to him outlining our requests for either a 7.5T weight limit (but with unfettered farm vehicle access) on the B1395, or for other measures such as a speed restriction. We have also requested that Town Bridge be resurfaced and that measures be investigated in designating South Parade as a Play Street. Finally, please be aware of the river bank stabilisation work due to take place opposite 79 High St from 8-29 July and the consequent road closure. This will involve piling alongside the riverbank and we have been told that HGV's will be diverted via the A17 and A153. Farm Vehicles will be permitted access. We have requested more clarification will let you know asap.

Please note the new website: <http://parishes.lincolnshire.gov.uk/SouthKyme> for Parish Council and Village Hall official documents which is being edited by Ms Donna Allbrook. The existing SK website continues to be managed by Peter Bettis. The Queens Birthday celebration held at the Village Hall on 11 June was a complete success and extremely well attended, in part due to the very successful use of 'Facebook' within the village. We are keen to continue the use of this medium in tandem with other traditional methods of communication. The lessons learned will also help provide an organisational template for any similar events in the future.

The HECKOFF action group with the aid of Dr Yelland has briefed local MPs and DECC representatives on the extremely flawed original Noise Assessment Report and this should go a long way in convincing DECC that the entire project should be shelved. We await more updates in due course. Please read the Dog Warden's update but note that she has now issued her first fixed penalty notice. With the second Dog Warden about to start training I do hope that everyone in the village gets the message that dog littering is totally unacceptable and very unsociable. To help we have even purchased yet another Dog Bin which will be sited at the southern end of the wooden footbridge. The message is simple; pick up or be fined.

VILLAGE TIDY GROUP

We are a friendly bunch of volunteers dedicated to the upkeep of the village, and new recruits are always welcome. Why not come and join us. We meet on the last Saturday of each month outside the Coronation Hall at 8.30am.

WILDLIFE ON YOUR DOORSTEP?

Have you ever wondered which animals and birds visit your garden at night or wanted to get a closer view of the birds at your feeders and nest boxes during the day? Have you put up bat boxes but don't know whether they are being used?

The Postcode Local Trust has kindly awarded the Village Hall a grant to acquire some camera traps and bat detectors to help us establish a clearer picture of the wildlife on our doorsteps, in the village and in the wider countryside. As well as helping undertake some survey work, I thought that some of you may be interested in hiring them for your own use. We should be able to provide them at a very modest hire charge, but will require a substantial deposit that will of course be returned to you when you return the equipment safely. If you look at the web and Google "wildlife footage + camera traps" on the "video" tab you will see some of the footage that other people have captured on camera traps.

I have seen roe and muntjac deer, foxes, badgers, hares, rabbits, polecat, moles, rats, various mice, shrews, voles, squirrel, water vole, mink, frogs, toads, and lizard. Unfortunately the otters have eluded me, although I have seen verifiable signs. Other people have seen them, including daytime sightings. A dog otter typically operates over around 20km of river, so there may only be one in the River Slea/Kyme Eau and sometimes not at all.

Then there are all the birds, bats, dragonflies & damselflies, butterflies and moths. I haven't seen a grass snake or adder locally, have you? I would be interested to know what you have seen that has surprised you and whether you would be interested in any of the following

- Hiring a camera trap (probably no more than £1 a day)
- Hiring a bat detector (ditto)
- Finding out more about bats (e.g. if I could organise a talk in the hall and an evening walk by Lincs Bat Group)
- Finding out more about otters in Lincs (again, if I could organise a local talk)
