SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

With the leaves falling and Autumn in full swing, let us hope for a mild one or even an 'Indian Summer' which in the UK is generally more akin to a monsoon! In the background, the Parish Council (PC) continues to do its best to address your concerns to make the village a nicer place to live. Remember the PC does not have the monopoly on ideas so please come along to the public forums preceding every PC meeting to put forward your thoughts and initiatives for consideration.

At the last PC meeting In September Councillor Alex Alexander was co-opted to the PC. However, we still have one vacancy for anyone who may have the time, energy and community spirit that is needed. The Heckington Fen Wind Farm issue has not yet been resolved by the Government and time is now extremely short to meet the final Feb 2018 deadline for Ecotricity to prove compliance with the original and variation planning applications. Once again, no news is good news and every day that passes increases the odds of a successful outcome to stop this blight on the fenland landscape. You will notice that the area around the main village noticeboard has been cleared of foliage and a big thank you to Colin Louth for his efforts. The noticeboard itself is deteriorating and needs refurbishment, and this is ongoing, whilst I have also noticed that the post box badly needs a lick of paint and I have approached the sub-contractor for Royal Mail to deal with this. As mentioned in the last edition of the Tower, the committee for the youth club (now termed Activity Group) will be working over the winter to make sure that we have all the elements in place to start this initiative for the youngsters of South Kyme by the summer of 2018.

Furthermore, the PC and Village Hall Committee have agreed in principle to purchase a ceremonial flag pole for the village and are now working out the details although it is likely to be sited within the village hall grounds. The Dog Warden (Emma) continues to perform her task diligently and is currently working on producing posters to highlight the issues surrounding dog mess which, as you know, is a constant problem. Some of you will have spotted American Mink on the river and we believe there are 2 adults and 3 kits. We have sought advice from a variety of agencies and are also in the process of writing to the local farmers to ask for assistance with trapping. These animals are voracious predators and will decimate any wildlife but fortunately they tend to move on once food stocks run out. (ironically the best way to get rid of them is for otters to move in!). We are aware of the problem and will monitor the indigenous wildlife for the next year but if the problem continues we have other options available and the offer of a loan of several traps. The 'Best Kept Village' competition this year did not see us through to the finals but it was a close-run thing and the judging panel scored us very highly at over 90%. Some Gardens and premises lacked the sparkle that is required however, the final report was extremely positive with only minor issues noted and this bodes well for future competitions.

The Village Tidy Group continues to present the village in a pristine condition and should be complimented on its collective and individual efforts. Meeting on the last Saturday of each month the next VTG,s are: 28 Oct and 25 Nov, thereafter, and over the winter, they will be advertised as required. New individuals are always welcome. The group meets behind the village hall at 0830 and works for about 3 hours before retiring to the 'Hume' to socialise.

The next council meeting and public forum will commence at 7.30 pm Thursday 23 November in the Coronation Hall.

Finally, from everyone at the Parish Council, have a fantastic and safe Christmas and New Year.

At the time of writing we have just started another school year and already our thoughts are turning towards Christmas.

2016-17 was another highly successful year at school in terms of the attainment and progress our children have made and I am delighted to report a summary of this to you.

In Reception, the percentage of pupils achieving a Good Level of Development (achieving at least the expected level) was in line with the National Average. The percentage of pupils achieving the expected standard in reading and number was above the National Average. By the end of Year 2 the percentage of pupils working at the new national expected standard as a minimum was above the national average in writing and maths but just below in reading. In Year 6, the percentage of pupils who achieved the national expected standard was above the National Average for all subjects for the second year running.

In terms of the progress that the Year 6 pupils made from the end of Year 2, our progress scores at school are all positive which means on average, pupils by the end of Year 6 do better than those with similar prior attainment nationally.

If your child was born between 1.9.13 and 31.8.14 then he/she is eligible to start school in September 2018. Applications can be made online at www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schooladmissions or over the phone by telephoning the Schools Admission Team on 01522 782030. **Applications cannot be made until the 13th November 2017.** Applications must be received by the School Admissions Team by 12 noon on 15th January 2018. We will be holding an open day event in school on Tuesday 21st November at 2pm. If this time is not convenient then please contact school to arrange a time to come and view our school. Wing Cdr Donald 'Steve' Steventon DSO, DFC – RAF photo-reconnaissance ace

He joined the Royal Air Force in the late thirties to train as a pilot and in the world war that followed he flew unarmed Spitfires and Mosquitoes on risky photo-reconnaissance (PR) missions across Europe. 'Steve' became a squadron commander during 1942–43 and played a crucial part in uncovering Hitler's V-weapons programme. He continued to fly PR sorties up until the end of the war and was much decorated for his skill and courage as a pilot and a leader of men. When peace returned his flying career took quite a different turn, but in the end it was an unexpected twist of fate that decided how it should end.

On 15 May 1942, 'Steve' Steventon was flying a Spitfire PR IV (R7037) high above the western coastline of the Baltic on a sortie to photograph the north German port of Swinemünde after covering Kiel, and on the look-out for the German heavy cruiser *Prinz Eugen* sailing to Kiel from Norway. Far below he spotted an airfield on the northern tip of the island of Usedom. Noticing evidence of recent development activity he decided to switch on his cameras and made three short runs over the island. Unbeknown to 'Steve' and the photo-interpreters his cameras had stumbled across the first evidence of a German ballistic missile test site and that the earthworks were part of a secret Nazi programme to develop a long range ballistic missile capable of hitting targets in Britain – the V2 rocket. On 10 February 1943 'Steve's' award of the DSO was gazetted: "Since being awarded the DFC, this officer has taken part in a large number of operational sorties, and now commands the squadron. Sqn Ldr Steventon has displayed great ability and leadership, which has maintained the efficiency and morale of the squadron".

'Steve's' extensive operational experience as a PR pilot and squadron commander had been recognised by the Americans, who awarded him the Air Medal on 20 July "in recognition of valuable services rendered in connection with the war". The Americans requested that the RAF allow him to join a delegation of three USAAF officers (all of whom were operational photo-reconnaissance pilots) led by Colonel Elliott Roosevelt (son of US President Franklin D. Roosevelt) with the job of investigating several reconnaissance aircraft then under development in the USA. The award of the American DFC to 'Steve' was announced on 26 July for "outstanding technical skill, resourcefulness and courage in successfully executing numerous long-range photo reconnaissance missions" between 1942 and 1944.

When 'Steve' was posted to the RAF Flying College at Manby in Lincolnshire in September 1950 as a flight commander and instructor, he and his wife of three years, Anne, moved to a house in the village of Little Cawthorpe, about 5 miles from the airfield. With the dangers of wartime flying now in the past, 'Steve' and Anne were looking to a more stable future and eagerly awaited news about their application to adopt a child as their own. After breakfast on the morning of Tuesday 18 September 1951 'Steve' waved goodbye to Anne and drove the short distance to Strubby. Little more than a minute after his take-off in a de Havilland Vampire, an explosion caused the Goblin engine to catch fire within seconds. 'Steve' radioed Strubby tower to request an emergency landing, and at 300ft on the downwind leg 'Steve' rolled the jet onto its back and baled out. His parachute streamed but did not deploy fully and he was killed when he crashed through the roof of a cottage on Beesby Manor Farm at Alford.

Two months later the *Journal of the Royal Air Force College* recorded 'Steve's' passing with these humbling words: "Steve' was one of those exceptional figures that Cranwell has consistently produced at intervals in its history. In a series of notable appointments his success was immediate and outstanding. He was something of a legend in the Royal Air Force for his acute mind, his personality and the indomitable courage that earned his redoubled decorations".

“LEST WE FORGET”



11 November 1918 signalled the end of The Great War between the Allies and Germany. Since 1921, the nation has come together to remember the sacrifices that hundreds of thousands of British and Commonwealth Service men and women made not just during the Great War, but World War II and all subsequent wars and conflicts including Iraq and Afghanistan.
