EDITORIAL

The weather patterns seem to be all out of kilter all over the world. On 21 July 2016, Mitribah in Kuwait recorded a maximum temperature of 54.0 °C (129.2 °F), tying Death Valley's highest reliably recorded temperature on Earth, while Basra in Iraq reached 53.9 °C (129.0 °F) that day and this weekend we have been seeing the terrible floods in Texas caused by Hurricane Harvey. Summer may have been a bit of a damp squib for us in many respects, but all in all, we have a lot to be thankful for in our little part of the world, living as we do without fear of such catastrophic weather events. The only downside of the damp summer has been that the grass needed cutting a bit more often than usual.

Talking of cutting grass, we all owe a debt of gratitude to those volunteers who go out and cut the grass and litter pick throughout the village, which helps to make South Kyme an attractive place to live in. Thanks is also due to the local farmers who donate fuel for the large ride on mower that does such a grand job in keeping the river bank top passable from the village all the way to the church. We hope that South Kyme will do well in the best kept village competition this year and maybe replicate the success of 2010.

The spectre of wind turbines being erected at Heckington Fen still looms large. Dale Vince, the owner of Ecotricity has openly admitted that they are years away from producing an effective radar mitigation scheme that would satisfy the MOD. However, the government department (DBEIS) that has the final say on the revised planning application submitted by Ecotricity to circumvent the radar mitigation clause has made no statement other than "...the application to vary the Heckington Fen consent is still being considered..." We can only hope that as the Conservative Government does not want anymore onshore wind turbines in England, that this considering will continue until the existing planning consent runs out in February next year, that is of course unless they reject it out of hand as the action group Heckoff has worked so hard to achieve.

One final thought, is "Where have all the duck gone?" When we moved here in 2002, there were upwards of 50 duck on the river at the bottom of our garden every day throughout the year, now, we are lucky if we see half a dozen at any one time and some days not even that!

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Whilst we all sit here and wait for the summer to arrive properly (might be a while!) I will fill you all in with a quick resume of Parish Council (PC) business, active or otherwise. Still no new updates on the wind farm with the exception that Ecotricity have stated that a radar mitigation scheme is not now a realistic proposition in the immediate future, if at all – and this was an original planning stipulation! We continue to remain positive for a successful outcome. The SID (Speed Indicator Device) is back and running but currently with North Kyme. The best kept village competition continues with final judging now taking place and we await details of the first meeting of the 'Activity Group' committee which was endorsed by both the PC and Village Hall Committee (VHC) earlier this year.

At the July council meeting, the NKDC Environmental Health manager gave a useful update on the issues surrounding dog ownership, responsibilities and legal requirements. Some owners seem to think that it is acceptable not to pick up after their dogs when crossing the fens outside of the main public footpaths within the village. This is incorrect and dog owners should be aware that they are legally required to pick up after their dogs at all times and on ANY land within or outside the South Kyme curtilage. Basically, if it is not your own private land then the legal (and moral) requirement to pick up exists. Furthermore, if as a resident you are having problems with nearby continuously noisy dogs you should in the first instance speak to the owners about the issue. Should the owners not be very understanding or are clearly unhelpful then NKDC should be approached for further direction.

The grass cutting grant we receive (in lieu of ineffective contractors) from the County Council has, as I have alluded to previously, been cut by over 90% from 2017 onwards. We will now have to start looking at other ways in which to financially support the Village Tidy Group (VTG), which continues to do a great job and meets on the last Saturday of each month (next meetings are: 30 September & 28 October) from 8.30 am to approximately 11.30 am, whence we retire to The Hume for refreshments (thank you to Maeve and VJ for continuing to provide the food). If you want an attractive village then please come along and lend a hand and let's not leave it to the same people time and again. Whilst on a similar subject and if not mentioned by the editor, all owners of property on the river bank are to note that they are responsible for keeping their trees adequately pruned and/or pollarded so as not to block either the public footpath or the river. If you are in any doubt seek advice from the VTG or Trevor/Bernard. Everyone please note the Clay Bank road closure for repairs 11 Sep for 5 days.

Finally, at the last meeting of the Council it was decided unanimously that an official flagpole was needed for official ceremonial occasions so that the village could commemorate a variety of official dates/events. The Council also decided that if the VHC could provide the pole then the PC would provide the various flags. At its meeting of 21 August, the VHC agreed in principle to supply a suitable pole. Discussions as to most appropriate size, cost and position are ongoing.

The next council meeting and public forum will commence at 7.30 pm on 17 September in The Coronation Hall.

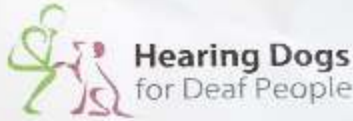
MEDIUMSHIP - OPEN PLATFORM EVENINGS
