SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

At the time of going to print we look forward with eager anticipation to the May Bank Holiday weekend celebrations and Annual Village meeting although on a slightly dispiriting note it is unfortunate that due to a lack of bookings the Medieval Dinner on the Friday night has had to be cancelled, despite the superb promotional efforts of the Festival Committee and in particular Mrs Caroline Midgley. A very small village like ours needs all the support it can get for these events if they are to prove financially viable and hence successful, so please engage early and let us have your feedback and thoughts on how we can improve things in the future. The old adage however, "you only get what you put in" has never been more appropriate.

On a more cheerful note, we can also now look forward to yet another general election on 8 June - I'll bet you can't wait!

At our last meeting of 23 March it was noted that we are still waiting for a decision by the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy concerning Ecotricity's revised planning application the proposed Heckington Fen wind farm site. In this sense no news is good news and with an 18 February 2018 expiry date for the original planning consent then any delay gives cause for optimism.

The Asset of Community Value (ACV) application by the parish council outlined in previous editions of The Tower was ultimately turned down at the final NKDC planning meeting on the grounds that we also have a Village Hall in which to hold community events/meetings. Their decision is final and we accept it.

The children's play area/youth club initiative was awaiting a series of options to be presented to the Village Hall Committee for a viability decision but due to recent resignations from the Council this has now been put on hold pending further work. I will outline my thoughts at the Village Meeting, but either way, a successful outcome would be entirely dependent upon self help and the ultimate support of parents. If parents are unable to support this initiative then it will not get out of the starting blocks. I will also use the Village Meeting to propose the establishment of a sub-committee to work on a Parish Plan as outlined in the previous edition of The Tower and also to try and solicit volunteers for the two recently vacant Parish Councillor positions.

We have just written to NKDC seeking clarification and guidance on the establishment of Public Space Protection Orders as regards a "Dogs on Leads" area between the bridges and for the expansion of fixed penalty notices to include dog owners not in possession of poop bags.

Similarly, given the lack of response to our long standing and known street lighting defects, we have sought the help of the County Councillor to try and elicit some action by LCC. Furthermore, we have sought clarification on the dates for the resurfacing of Town Bridge but, unfortunately, due to an internal 'LCC Highways Department initiative to restructure the criteria to determine priorities, our work is now in the 'future programmes' category and will hopefully appear on the LCC's website in the coming weeks. I will keep you updated on all these issues as and when we get some firm feedback.

As you are aware we will be entering the 'Best Kept Village' competition again this year and preliminary judging starts as early as 27 May and then goes on throughout the summer depending on whether a village makes it through the early stages, with final decisions made in September. Please let us all make a collective effort and see if we can match our success of 2010.

The Village Tidy Group (VTG) is now in full swing with the next Saturday clean-up scheduled for 27 May and thereafter 24 June and 29 July. I would encourage all those who have not yet attended to come along if you are available and give a few hours of your time for the benefit of the whole village. The Tidy Group meets at 8.30 am behind the village hall and then retires (normally by 11.30 am) to The 'Hume' thereafter for lunch and a few drinks.

You will all have noticed that the SID (Speed Indicator Device) has been absent. This was due to a radar defect and, after contacting the manufacturer for a repair quote, the parish council and North Kyme parish council have jointly agreed to share the repair bill. I am hoping it will be back in action by June at the latest when we will also look at alternative positions, providing we can procure additional fixing brackets.

For those Council owned properties in South Parade, Clay Bank and Brownlow Close you should have received a letter in December 2016 outlining NKDC plans to conduct exterior painting between April and October of this year and you will be contacted with a start date in due course. This is good news for all and I hope it does not cause any inconvenience to residents.

WIND TURBINES - A MIGRATING BIRD'S WORST NIGHTMARE?

Every year, many people up and down the country take part in the RSPB big bird watch event to ascertain the numbers of various birds found in our countryside. The following research, carried out over ten years ago makes for sober reading, the more so, because it is unlikely that any consideration is given to small migrating birds when planning and siting the huge offshore wind farms in The North Sea.

Bird collisions at an offshore platform in the North Sea

Collisions with offshore structures in the North Sea could account for the mortality of hundreds of thousands of nocturnally migrating birds.

A study to assess, for the first time, the circumstances of mass fatalities at an offshore structure, including the species involved, their numbers, ages, body conditions and injuries was undertaken by some German researchers.

At an unmanned tall offshore research platform in the southeastern North Sea, bird corpses were collected on 160 visiting days from October 2003 to December 2007. Corpses were identified to species and kinds of injury, ages, and fat and muscle scores were determined. Nocturnal bird calls were recorded, identified to species and quantified. Local and large-scale weather parameters were also considered.

Results: A total of 767 birds of 34 species, mainly Thrushes, European Starlings and other passerines, were found at 45 visits. Most carcasses were in good body condition and young birds were not more affected than adults. Three quarters of 563 examined individuals had collision induced injuries. Birds in poor body condition were less likely to be collision victims than those in good condition. Mass collision events at the illuminated offshore structure coincided with increasingly adverse weather conditions and an increasing call intensity of nocturnal birds.

Conclusions: Assuming an average of 150 dead birds per year at this single offshore structure and additionally assuming that a considerable proportion of the corpses were not found, we estimate that mortality at the 1000+ human structures in the North Sea could reach hundreds of thousands of birds. Since offshore industrialization will progress and collision numbers at offshore turbines will consequently increase considerably, we recommend reinforced measures to reduce bird strikes at offshore structures, especially in the light of substantial declines in some migrant species.
