SOUTH KYME VILLAGE DOG WARDEN

The summer is flying by, however, we still have an on-going issue with irresponsible dog owners who misguidedly think scooping the poop doesn't apply to them despite the parish council having installed a 4th dog bin at the southern end of the foot bridge. There really is NO excuse not to pick up after your dogs. Furthermore, I have also had the additional problem of loose dogs to contend with, some of which have killed livestock! If you are a dog owner please take a look on the government website at the following link <https://www.gov.uk/control-dog-public/overview>. As a dog owner you and you alone are responsible for both keeping your dog safe and the public safe from your dog! Your dog may well be friendly and good natured, but if it jumps up at someone that's terrified of dogs this can be deemed as being dangerously out of control and if reported, it comes with serious consequences that could ultimately include both your dog being put down and up to 6 months imprisonment for the owner! You should also be aware that farmers also have the right to kill dogs worrying their livestock! So please take a read of the guidance at the link and make sure that you are aware of how best to protect your dog, other animals and yourself.

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Whilst thinking about what a nice summer it is turning out to be; even my twisted willows are shedding their leaves in protest at the dry weather!, the drizzle has started and an October type forecast for the weekend fills me with dismay. More so since I am off to Edgbaston for the 20/20 cricket finals at the weekend for my future Son-In-Laws Stag do. Oh how we love the British weather!. I digress therefore back to the Parish Council update.

You will all have been impacted to some degree and probably with some annoyance, by the High Street stabilisation works adjacent to the river that took place (Twice!) at the end of last month and beginning of this one. The work is now finally completed, and whilst functional, we are still not entirely happy with the aesthetics of the project however, I am assured that Slea Nav will add further Coir matting in due course to improve the overall look. Highway matters continue to be a cause for concern across the board. Speeding is a perennial problem and whilst the SID helps, it is not the panacea. Speed limits on Low Road have been rejected by LCC however, should we manage to establish a play area on Low Road (one of our latest aspirations) then the Highways Dept will review signage and possibilities of restrictions. Similarly, our requests for weight and/or speed restrictions on the B1395 have been listened to and sympathised with, but being classified as a strategic road, no modifications to limitations will currently be entertained. Town Bridge needs resurfacing and this request, subject to financial conditions, will be met hopefully by the end of the year. To underpin final decisions on all of the above traffic survey equipment has been installed (shame it went in during the road works and diversion of all HGV's!).

The report on the significant flaws in the Noise Impact Assessment (and increased EAM – very low frequency noise!) on the Heckington Fen wind farm by the HeckOff scientist (Dr Yelland) are now on the desk of Greg Clark, the minister of the Dept of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (formerly DECC) for his consideration. With local MP support and a much reduced governmental appetite for onshore farms we are hopeful that the action group will force the wind farm's cancellation. Either way a third round of consultations is now planned. The Viking Link Project (1400MW underwater cable link between Denmark and UK terminating near Boston) continues its progress and a full round of environmental/wild life impact assessments is being conducted as well as further consultations – I will keep you posted.

As previously mentioned the Dog Warden has been in action now for some months. However, a few unscrupulous individuals continue to let dog fouling ruin the lives of others. Not only is it illegal and inconsiderate, it poses a health risk. I am considering asking NKDC to raise the fixed penalty to £500 and see where that gets us. The second Dog Warden still awaits her training package but will be active soon and there is now a new dog bin at the end of the wooden footbridge over the river between High Street and Low Road.

A round up of minor items on the PC's agenda includes; removal of the Golf Club sign and hopefully a replacement if and when they have the funds, the re-anchoring of the bench outside the village hall and agreement by the Village Hall Committee to install an outside tap for the benefit of the entire village. A further Planning submission for a two storey dwelling has been submitted for the land between 15-17 High Street and the PC is in the process of formulating a response. We are also liaising with the water authorities to ensure that the river maintains a higher overall level to both protect the banks from erosion and to also allow the 2 narrow boats to float properly. Sadly the bench at the entrance to low road is in a sorry state of repair and has probably passed its sell by date. It will probably be removed and maybe replaced in due course. Additionally, I now sit in on all the Village Hall Committee meetings to ensure that we are working as team, ensure awareness, spread knowledge and to cross pollinate ideas. Of note, I gleaned that the National Grid team will be conducting consultations with residents in September/October and further information and dates will be published soon.

SOYA BEANS

Growing soya beans is one of the largest crops in America, and it has been subsidized to make cheap animal feed. Most of the soya grown is genetically modified (GMO), but, so far, there is limited data suggesting eating GMO soy is harmful to human health. Research on human placental tissue, though, does suggest pesticides on GMO soy may have toxic effects and GMO soya beans are known to have more pesticide residues than conventional and organic soya beans.

Soya is the number 1 source of isoflavones and may provide protection against ovarian cancer, multiple myeloma, and breast cancer. Soya milk can also provide similar amounts of calcium to cow's milk.
