



EDITORIAL

The temperatures outside may sometimes belie the fact that we are now well into the spring season, but looking at the natural world around us, there is no mistaking the signs - ducklings on the river, birds nesting, plants and trees bursting into life and yes, the lawn to cut a couple of times each week,

Many of you will no doubt have seen the work carried out to stabilise the river banks by The Slea Navigation Trust with volunteers from the village and RAF Digby. Once the plants in the coir rolls have established, it should make for an attractive edge to the river and be good for wildlife too. Many thanks to Steph Munks for allowing the coir rolls to be stored at Home Farm and also for forklifting the pallets onto the river bank as and when required. You may also be interested to know that the large fluctuations that sometimes occur in the river level should now be a thing of the past, as The Environment Agency has taken steps to ensure a constant level all year round rather than artificially lowering the river level for the winter months. This measure will greatly enhance the amenity value of the river and reduce erosion of the banks.

Many of you will remember the problems last year with the sewerage pipework from the pumping station on Low Road to the treatment works just outside the village, resulting in excavations in High Street to find the cause. The system is already overloaded and blockages are not infrequent, the last one being over the weekend of 16/17 April this year in High Street - the blockage was caused by 'Wet Wipes' and 'backed up' the drains of many houses on High Street. It is important that we all make sure that insoluble articles such as wet wipes, disposable nappies and sanitary items are not be flushed down the toilet - it is not a pleasant experience to have raw sewage flowing over your garden.

We have two voting opportunities coming up over the next couple of months. First up in May is the vote for the new Police Commissioner for Lincolnshire. Who are the candidates and what do they stand for? To date we have no idea, so how can we take this position seriously and make an informed decision to vote when information on the candidates is scant to non-exisitant? The second and probably most important vote in a generation is for IN, or OUT in the EU referendum. Listen carefully to the reasoned arguments being made and don't be panicked by the scare tactics of the government and others, but be very certain when you vote, that the plan for the EEC/EU has always been for a single European state with a common currency and harmonised laws and an 'IN' vote will bring about that eventuality. *Mervyn & Judy Head*



SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Now in the throes of spring at last, I was awoken this morning by my canine companions call of nature to what can only be described as an 'arctic blizzard'! - no wonder the British are preoccupied by the weather! (and it's now like a summer's day! – I give up). Back to more mundane but important matters of the Parish Council, whose workload seems to be increasing in line with ever more EU regulation! – so plenty to update you on:

The 'Heck Off' campaign against the Heckington Fen wind turbine farm is gaining significant traction and momentum; fundraising is ongoing and everyone involved in the action group is committed and driven to achieving a favourable outcome. A full update has been provided separately in the Heck Off March newsletter.

You may be aware that the LCC (Lincolnshire County Council) can no longer afford to operate streetlights as in the past and with a cost of £5m per year this is unsustainable. To this end, and to reduce costs by £1.7m and to reduce CO2 and light pollution, cuts are in the offing. Once we know, if any cuts are being made in South Kyme I will let you know. In a similar, but equally if not more important vein is the proposal to terminate the LCC/Highways amenity grant for grass cutting in the village from 1 April 2017. This will have an impact on the longer term viability and funding of the Village Tidy Group. We have written to the department concerned expressing our displeasure and await a response. With funding a common theme you also need to be aware that in his last budget the chancellor announced that our region will receive devolved powers from central government. Our partnership will include 10 councils from the Humber to the Wash, borne of the common belief that local services, including transport, housing, skills training and flood management can be run more effectively by local authorities rather than by central government, who will provide £450m over the next 30 years - time will tell. I also mentioned the 'Local Plan' for central Lincolnshire some time ago and attended a briefing in which they outlined the timeline for adoption. If all goes well, this will be by the end of the year. This plan provides the backbone for any 'Neighbourhood plans' (I am in liaison with the Partnerships Manager in Sleaford to discuss the way ahead) that might be adopted by towns and villages, and gives targets for housing, employment and infrastructure. South Kyme is a 6th tier small village with only modest (17 dwellings) growth targets (Lincoln, Sleaford and Gainsborough being the key areas of growth).

We have also just been made aware of a new 1400MW High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) electricity link between Denmark and UK (termed Viking Link) terminating on the east coast near Boston and linked, via underground cables to a proposed new converter station near the Bicker Fen substation. The council are being consulted as to the best of 4 location options as we write and I will keep you all informed of progress. On more colloquial issues, the Sleaford Navigation work on stabilizing the river bank with coir rolls has been completed and this should halt the river bank erosion in some key areas. The provision of the coir rolls has been funded by the Environment Agency. The new 20 foot container for storing the village tidy group equipment has now been installed behind the village hall and the outside tap is imminent. The Village Tidy Group is once again in full swing with some new equipment and are doing an outstanding job. Volunteers are always welcome – even if only to help with the 'kitty' in the Hume afterwards!!

We are in the process of migrating the South Kyme Website to one hosted via the Lincolnshire County Council site and this should be up and running with a new Webmaster in the coming weeks. Once fully functional, we will also look at setting up a South Kyme 'Facebook' section to hopefully capture the younger elements within the village. All dogs in the village should now be micro-chipped (as of 6 Apr 16) and for updates on this topic please read the accompanying 'Dog Warden Corner' from Emma but note we have applied for a grant to purchase a scanner which can detect microchips! The 'Village Draw' is now in abeyance awaiting some community spirited volunteer to take over the mantle. Originally set up over 20 years ago it eventually matured to provide funding for both the Village Hall and the Church in equal measure (as well as awarding monthly prizes) and in this sense has provided valuable financial support to key components of the village. We desperately need a new leader and some volunteer collectors, please contact me if you are interested in shaping the 'new' village draw.

Finally, don't forget the May Bank holiday festivities when we welcome the many narrow boats including the Hume quiz night on Friday 29 April, 70's & 80's night at the Village Hall on Saturday 30 April and Village Fete Sun 1 May from about 2.00pm, with the Annual Parish meeting commencing at 4.00pm in the village hall.

Don't forget to vote on EU membership (or otherwise!) 23 Jun and also be aware that there will be high street stabilisation road works and disruption (opposite the Kingfisher statue) starting 18 July for 2 weeks and road closures and diversions will be in place.

The next Parish Council meeting will commence at 7.30pm on Thursday 19 May and will be preceded by the AGM at 7.00pm.

HEALTH TOPICS

SWEETENERS

In terms of nutritional value, sugar and corn syrup are roughly equal in that they have basically no nutritional value. High fructose corn syrup, however, has been found to be contaminated with mercury and should probably be avoided. Two sweeteners, black strap molasses and date sugar (just powdered whole dates), do actually have significant nutritional value. Most artificial sweeteners have been linked to health problems, at least in rare cases. Stevia appears to be harmless as long as you don't consume too much.

SOUTH KYME VILLAGE DOG WARDEN

As your new village dog warden, I have been in the post now for about a month. I have enjoyed meeting lots of you fellow dog walkers whilst I've been out in the village with my two black labs on 'poop patrol'. As ever, I am always happy to listen to ideas and welcome input from you all as to specific problem areas, as this helps me gauge where I'm best needed to patrol.

During my patrols it has become clear that the people who don't think they need to scoop their dogs mess and dispose of it in the bins provided seem to be doing this in the areas they think they are less likely to get spotted – **but I am now onto this!** The built up areas are generally clean but on the river bank walks it becomes obvious that people think they can get away with it, or simply think that it's ok to leave it; this is not the case.

On any public walk-way, be it a built up village area or more rural river bank, you must pick up your dog's mess, bag and bin it, either in your home rubbish bin or the dog poop bins provided. Anyone caught leaving dog mess behind will be awarded with an on the spot fixed penalty notice and served with a caution. There are no excuses with the only exemptions being blind people as it poses a direct health risk to them. **CHILDREN ARE NOT EXEMPT** and must follow the rules. If they are old enough to walk a dog then they are old enough to pick up the mess. Of note; there has been an increase in dog fouling over the Easter holiday period so I am led to conclude it is due to an increase in children walking their owner's dogs. Parents take note, that if a child is spotted leaving dog mess behind then the parents will be served with the fixed penalty notice. It therefore falls squarely on the parents shoulders to brief their children accordingly or suffer the consequences. As of 1 May 2016 random dog walkers will be asked to provide evidence that they intend to pick up their dog mess (i.e. they must be in possession of poop bags). Lack of evidence shows intent NOT to clean up after their dog(s) which will also result in a fixed penalty notice.

Finally, please let us keep South Kyme the beautiful clean village it should be by working together and making walking in the village an enjoyable experience for everyone.
