We have also seen many more butterflies around in the garden and along the river banks, including species such as the Common Blue, Small Skipper and Painted Lady. There has also been an increase in the number of dragonflies, damselflies and frogs. Leaving an untrimmed margin at the bottom of the river banks for wildlife is now beginning to pay dividends.

You will all have had put through your letter boxes a letter of objection concerning the Wind Farm. Please read through the letter, complete the front, and sign it on the back and return it to us as soon as possible please if you have not already done so.. It is very important that Ecotricity are prevented from getting an unprecedented extension to the consent for the wind farm that expired in February this year. The campaign against the wind farm has been very expensive and to date has cost over £10,500 which has been raised by donations by a small number of local people. More funds are needed to fight the cause and Heckoff need your support now more than ever to continue. The next fundraising event is advertised below.

Guy Fawkes night celebrations may well spread over several days, so will all pet owners please ensure that their pets are indoors over this period to avoid unnecessary stress and possible injuries.

Letter from the Ministry Team

At the service of remembrance we will remember those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom and especially those who left the village at the start of the call to arms during the harvest of July 1914. Those named on the memorials within the church did not come back they made the supreme sacrifice on a foreign field. Today those who serve are remembered in our prayers and we give thanks for their dedication. This was brought home recently with the shopping bag left on a bus causing a scare in Lincoln. The enemy today hides behind cowardice and terror.

You are all are welcome to come along to any of the services.

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Autumn has been a busy period for the Parish Council (PC) with headway being made on several fronts. In particular, the recently installed landing stages elicited a number of genuine concerns raised at the last PC meeting in September and these issues, amongst others, were addressed at a site meeting with Slea Nav on 18th October. In summary, Slea Nav remain the owners of the facility by virtue of legal clauses within the conditions of the grant and are therefore responsible for all risks, health and safety, maintenance and the removal of trespassing water craft. Agreement has been reached on the provision of a new all-weather surface access path to the lower pier; running adjacent to the fencing at the western boundary of the site which will also provide more than suitable disabled access. The moorings, being on land owned by the PC, will be classified as 'Private Moorings' and be subject to a 72-hour maximum stay. Notices to this effect will shortly be erected. Both piers will now also be connected albeit with a slight step, to remove the gap and mitigate any injuries from falls whilst a ladder will also be installed to aid any recovery of personnel from the water. Finally, progress on the Winding Hole is being made and Slea Nav are hopeful that this can be built within the next 6 – 12 months.

The village noticeboard now has a contractor who has agreed to complete the refurbishment and this should be done before the end of November. The Community Speed Watch programme continues to frustrate and progress has been slow (unlike the traffic!) and still awaits final confirmation of the training provision and dates. Additionally, a 'No Car Parking' sign will shortly be erected on the PC owned land near new bridge but not near the landing stages/opposite Munks Farm due to the need for large vehicular access to the farm. We are also still looking for a volunteer(s) to act as dog-warden to try and help reduce the problem of dog fouling along the river banks and adjacent roads/fenland.

You should have all received a recent letter of complaint crafted by the HeckOff Action Group, addressed to DBEIS, to protest at the blatant attempt by Ecotricity to circumvent time-honoured planning laws by asking to extend the time-lapsed planning deadline for the Heckington Fen wind farm by another 5 years to 8 Feb 2023. If you are in agreement, please sign the form and follow the mailing instructions. I will keep you all in the picture as and when developments occur.

On a very worrying note a recent incident involving the shooting of a cat (probably by an air rifle) on Low Road has, quite rightly, appalled a large number of residents, has caused significant distress and life-threatening injuries to an innocent pet and has cost the owners a hefty vet bill. This sort of behaviour will not be tolerated in any society let alone a quiet village. The Police are still investigating, but if anyone has any information whatsoever please contact them with details.

Don't forget what is probably the final Village Tidy Group (VTG) of the year on Saturday 24 November. Numbers are still low so, please if you have the time, come along and do your bit to help keep South Kyme a stunning looking village. The VTG normally meets on the last Saturday of the month at 8.30 a.m. behind the village hall and after 2 – 3 hours of grass cutting/litter-picking retires to the

Hume for a drinks and a free lunch. The next VTG in 2019 is likely to be in late February, but I will keep you posted.

Don't forget the WW1 centenary Remembrance Service at the Church at 11 a.m. Sunday 11 November and please come along for the annual festive Salvation Army carols, mulled wine and mince pies event on 18 December.

Finally, South Kyme Parish Council wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Prosperous New Year.

DEFIBRILLATORS IN SOUTH KYME

The primary defibrillator unit is sited at South Kyme Golf Club (yellow box located on the south facing club house wall). On ALL occasions ring 999 for the emergency services and ask for the South Kyme defibrillator access code (allows you to open the box to gain access to the defibrillator). Once the defibrillator has been accessed and delivered, the operator of the defibrillator should stay on the line to the emergency services for any operational guidance that maybe required.

There is also a defibrillator at Sycamore farm, Clay Bank, South Kyme which is available for use if required. Ring either David Casswell on 07711746902 or Michael Casswell on 07711746903.



At the time of writing we have just started another school year and already our thoughts are turning towards Christmas.

As a school we continually strive to keep up to date with the latest educational research to ensure our provision is the best that it can possibly be. This year we are involved in the following research projects:

1. Continuing with the Teaching of Maths Mastery Work Group we started last year.
2. Our Kingfisher team have been accepted on a Work Group organised by the East Midlands East (EME) Maths Hub in Southwell to develop language and pattern in Reception.
3. Our Kingfisher team have also been accepted on a project entitled 'Meta Cognition and Maths in the Early Years'.
4. Metacognition - Cognitive Theory. This is the second year that we are taking part in this action research group. We have been looking into and analysing methods of learning based upon research.
5. Using research to adapt teaching and learning with regards to supporting the acquisition of vocabulary.

This term we have set up The Billinghay CE Primary School 'Shop and Bank'. Our pupils can earn 'Blings', (virtual money) designed by pupils at school, and given out for a number of reasons such as excellent work, sporting achievements etc. They are also linked to our 'dojo' rewards system. Children will be able to visit the Shop and Bank on a Friday morning in the school hall. They can then either exchange their 'Blings' for prizes or bank them to save for a bigger prize. Our pupils could apply for positions, such as a bank manager or shopkeeper, and after an interview 6 pupils were chosen to run the Shop and Bank.

I would like to thank everyone for their ongoing support and we look forward to building on our successes this school year.

WHICH LOUSY LOW-LIFE SHOT OUR CAT???

On the 11th October 2018 our cat came in the house with fresh blood on his fur and holding one of his front legs up and we initially thought that he had been bitten by a dog or caught in fencing. After taking him to the vet for examination and x-rays, the vet contacted us to inform us that our cat had actually been shot!! The bullet had passed through his chest just missing his vital organs but had shattered his elbow on exit. The x-rays confirmed shrapnel was still present, and the vet advised that this would result in either amputation or a specialist vet to reset the bone and pin it. Our vet referred him to the specialist vet for his opinion and after an agonising wait the specialist vet confirmed that in his opinion he should be able to pin the broken bones to save our cat's leg which we were relieved about. The operation looks like it has been successful, however only time will tell. Our cat is now confined to a cage for 4 – 6 weeks whilst his leg is healing but then he has to remain housebound until the x-ray shows a full recovery has been made. Someone's callous actions has led not only to a huge cost in vets bills, but my concern is that this may happen again to my animals or yours!! This person needs to be found and dealt with in the proper manor.

“LEST WE FORGET”



11 November 1918 signalled the end of The Great War between the Allies and Germany. Since 1921, the nation has come together to remember the sacrifices that hundreds of thousands of British and Commonwealth Service men and women made not just during the Great War, but World War II and all subsequent wars and conflicts including Iraq and Afghanistan
We especially remember those young men from South Kyme killed in action (KIA) in The First World War, whose memorial is in the churchyard of South Kyme:
