EDITORIAL

Spring has finally arrived after a pretty dull and dismal winter and all of a sudden, we have gone from most plants being dormant to a riot of greenery and blossom in our gardens. This year so far, the fur has hardly been touched! You will see details later in this issue for the annual South Kyme duck race, but the real ducks, or rather ducklings seem to be in short supply on the river at the moment - have they been badly affected by the cold spring, or are we gradually losing our resident duck population, maybe to Mink?

I would like to announce that I have been invited to stand for the vacant position of District Councillor for our Ward on behalf of Lincolnshire Independents. On 24 May there is a by-election to elect a new District Councillor as a result of the resignation of the previous councillor due to ill health. Voting for your local District Councillor is probably more important than voting for your MP, and I believe that it is important to have a representative who lives locally and understands local problems. I will be delivering my election material in the coming days which will give more details.

No doubt most of you have noticed the flag pole outside the village hall that will fly the Lincolnshire flag as a norm and a change of flags to mark various national events. I believe that it is important for us to celebrate these events as part of our national identity and it also sets our village apart from the majority of our neighbours. I would also like to thank Bernard (Jim) Phillips for giving his time to raise and lower the various flags as required.

You will also notice in this issue that the usual activities for the Mayday weekend have been re-scheduled to take place at the Spring Bank Holiday weekend at the end of May. Hopefully the weather will be warmer and less windy then so that my entry in the duck race will manage to finish the course this year instead of ending up (as usual) entangled in the vegetation of the river bank and have to be recovered after the race has finished!

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Before I give a quick overview of recent Parish Council business I would like to take the opportunity to advertise both the new Parish Council Facebook members page (administered by Cllr Alex Alexander) and also the Official Parish Council Website (type in your browser: parishes.lincolnshire.gov.uk/southkyme) where anyone can view all the documentation supporting PC business. Between the two communications mediums we hope to ensure that information is now readily available to all age groups across the parish.

All too often I highlight dog fouling as a continuing problem and have, in the past, suggested we might adopt a 'Dogs-on-Leads' restriction (Public Space Protection Order) along the river bank. We have just written to NKDC requesting that this indeed be investigated and I will keep you in the picture should this be implemented. Furthermore, the dog warden position still remains vacant. With the initial planning for the proposed Heckington Fen Wind Farm having expired in February 2018, we have written to the government to ask for clarification that it has indeed been refused. You will all have noticed the new flag pole erected outside the village hall and after some light-hearted debate (as an ex naval man I suggested the Jolly Roger might be fun!) we decided on 7 different flags and a number of commemorative dates. The default position will be to fly the Lincolnshire Standard as the daily norm.

At a recent meeting, the issue of parking on the grass verges along the high street (primarily by visiting fisherman) was raised and it has been resolved to procure no parking signs to alleviate the problem. If you do see cars on the grass please kindly ask the owners to park them on the high street as this also helps with slowing the traffic. Whilst on the subject of roads we also have a village 'highways' walk-round planned with senior LCC management and our county councillor on 1 May. You can be sure we will raise all the recent representations (pot holes, dangerous state of Clay Bank with suggestions for speed/weight limits and, speeding on Low Road and High Street etc).

The Lincolnshire County Council decision to re-visit their policy on grass cutting (the subject of many a Tower comment last year) has resulted in the Parish seeing an uplift of funds for amenity grass cutting by some £160 to approximately £230 for this year. This is a welcome increase in the face of many current and planned cuts in council budgets. Staying with 'grass' the first full Village Tidy Group (VTG) will convene on Saturday 28 April and thereafter 19 May to avoid the Spring Bank holiday. However, please be flexible as the weather may dictate otherwise. We are still light on volunteers so please come along and help your village to maintain its normally immaculate state of presentation. All safety equipment will be provided and if you needed further incentive, we are once again entered in this year's best kept village competition. Everyone should aim to congregate behind the village hall by 8.30 am - we normally finish at by 11.30 am whence a social lunch at the 'Hume' is the norm.

I trust many of you attended the South Kyme Golf Club open evening held on Friday 6 April where the club outlined plans to construct 4 executive houses along skimmers lane. The PC will make an official response to this proposal at the appropriate time in the formal planning process.

You will be pleased to know that work will now start on the Sleaford Navigation Trust proposed landing stage/slipway sometime in late April/early May and with the lack of narrowboats this year and the suggestion to delay the festivities (The Tower - March/April edition), the decision has been taken to hold a Village Fete on Sunday 27 May. The village (Parish) annual meeting will also take place between 4pm and 5pm on the Sunday and will be preceded on Saturday 26 May by an evening fund-raising function. Full details will be advertised separately by the South Kyme Festival Committee.

Finally, the next Parish Council meeting will commence with the AGM at 7.15pm on Thursday 24 May immediately followed by the public forum and Parish Council meeting proper at 7.30 pm in the Coronation Hall.
