SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

With the Christmas and New Year festivities behind us, and a spring like weather forecast predicted for the coming week, it is a good time to update you on recent and upcoming Parish Council business.

Ongoing Topics:

The Heckington Fen Wind Farm opposition (HeckOff Action Group) continues to maintain pressure on the Secretary of State (SoS) for Business, Energy and Industrial strategy by recommending that NKDC (planning sub-committee) accept the recommendation for a new independent noise impact assessment. At its meeting of 17 January, this was unanimously accepted along with a rejection of the 'Variation' application (bigger turbine blades and preparatory ground works prior to having a Radar Mitigation Scheme signed off by the SoS/MoD) to the original planning consent. In a nut shell this means no concrete in the ground until these conditions are met and hence if the action group can delay Ecotricity work until after 18 February 2018 then the original planning consent will have expired.

The Asset of Community Value (ACV) listing application to NKDC for The Hume public house has now been forwarded and we await their decision.

Children's Play Area – this is an ongoing issue. With no easy solutions we are, however, resolved to explore all possibilities including a Village Hall option and Cllr Clark is acting as lead liaison. That said any favourable outcome would need the full support of parents.

Sleaford Navigation. The 'Leader' bid for the 'Destination South Kyme' (new winding hole and landing stages/water access point) by SleaNav has run into difficulties due to illness and uncertainty over the nature and approach of the funding bid. Despite now being unlikely to be in place for the May bank Holiday celebrations they still have another approach and are preparing a bid for an April submission. I will keep you posted.

Speeding. The Speed Indictor Device (SID) continues to be used on a monthly basis in partnership with North Kyme and has some effect at slowing traffic. We continue to liaise with the local police and I would like to see a more visible police presence but resources are scarce.

Dog Fouling. A constant problem. PSPO's (Public Space Protection Orders) are being investigated and will shortly introduce new measures such as imposing a 'Dogs on Leads' area between Town and New Bridge and expanding the penalty notice (Fine!) to dog owners not in possession of poop bags. The Dog Warden will keep you in the loop. The good news is that from 1 April 2017 the District Council will no longer charge parishes for the emptying of dog bins.

Highways. The council's protestations will see the re-surfacing of Town Bridge, albeit in the next financial year. In practice, due to the 3 month planning notice required for closures it will mean at the earliest probably in May 2017. I will let you know more in due course.

Village Tidy Group. The Tidy Group is about to swing into action again and any volunteers are most welcome. Upcoming tentative dates are:

Saturday 25 February: Tree pruning, notice board refurbishment, litter picking. Saturday 18 March (full clean up), Saturday 22 April and (Pre Bank Holiday) Saturday 27 May.

Telephone Kiosk. With a zero usage over the previous 12 months the Parish Council gave permission for its permanent removal.

May Bank Holiday Weekend Festival 28-30 April, this year coincides with Sleaford Navigation's 30th anniversary of the restoration of Bottom Lock and navigation reopening through to South Kyme. We are hoping for many narrow boats coming into South Kyme for this event.

Village Meeting. Sunday 30 April 6.00 pm in the village hall. This will take the same format as in 2016 and is your opportunity as a community to raise any matters or issues that you may have concerning the village.

Parish Plan. As previously published, the parish council is looking to establish a 'Parish Plan Sub Committee' or 'Steering Group' which would be responsible for formulating the plan in conjunction with residents and NKDC before final Parish Council approval. If you want to be involved in formulating the future vision for South Kyme, or have any comments/suggestions, please contact the Clerk to the council, or let me know at the village meeting.

Best Kept Village 2017 – We have decided to re-enter the competition for 2017 and hope that you will all enter into the spirit of things and help keep the village looking bright and tidy. A judging panel will visit during the summer with results announced in September. As winners in 2010 it would be good for the village if we could repeat that success.

Parish Council spending over £100 approved at the last meeting was £279.02 to NKDC for the emptying of the rubbish and dog waste bins.

The next Parish Council meeting and Public forum will commence at 7.30 pm on Thursday 23 March 2017.

ASSET OF COMMUNITY VALUE

Part 5 Chapter 3 of the Localism Act 2011 provides for a scheme called 'assets of community value'. Community assets can be nominated by parish councils or by groups with a connection with the community. Individuals cannot nominate community assets. If the nomination is accepted, local groups will be given time to come up with a bid for the asset when it is sold.

The right to bid only applies when an asset's owner decides to dispose of it. There is no compulsion on the owner to sell it. The scheme does not give first refusal to the community group, unlike the equivalent scheme in Scotland. It is not a community right to buy the asset, just to bid. This means that the local community bid may not be the successful one.

Certain types of land, most notably residential property, are exempt from being placed on the register. Owners of property placed on the register may appeal against its listing and can claim compensation if they can demonstrate its value has been reduced.

The provisions for a community group to prepare a bid only apply when the asset is being put up for sale. The act of listing the asset does not trigger a bidding process: it does not compel the owner of the listed asset to sell it, nor does it create any restriction on what the owner can do with the property while they own it.

Sleaford Navigation Trust - LEADER funding update.

In October, we hoped that we were near to submitting the second stage of our LEADER bid for Destination South Kyme. The deadline for submission was December 17th 2016. For the first part of the bid we had been fortunate to have the help of Geraint Coles who had had previous experience of similar funding bids. Unfortunately for us, but not for Geraint, the second stage coincided with him starting a new job in Wales which meant he had to focus his attention elsewhere. Consequently, Steve and I had to apply ourselves rather urgently to the business of completing the second stage bid, getting the relevant quotes for materials and writing the extended rationale for the project. We submitted the bid, a weighty tome, on December 15th and breathed a huge sigh of relief.

In January we received the expected list of queries on details of our submission. Many created no particular problems but others meant that we began to rethink the strategy of what we were doing. As a charity we had envisaged that our own volunteers would do a considerable amount of the work involved in the project. We had not realised that this would create problems within the bid over issues such as the ineligibility of the purchase of necessary tools and equipment. This led us to question whether this was the right approach for us and was something we felt we needed to take advice on before going further. Because we were doing the work ourselves, we needed to have multiple quotes for such items as fixing bolts for the water access decking and the normal 30-day time limited quotes were not eligible. The process seemed to anticipate that work would be completed by a contractor who would be able to supply an inclusive price.

An additional problem over the potential temporary unavailability of volunteers to complete the work within the required timescale, led us to consider that it might be a good idea to look again at our method of delivery of the project. After discussion with the directors, it was agreed that I write to inform the Kestevens LEADER team that, at the moment, Sleaford Navigation Trust did not feel in a position to take our LEADER bid any further.

We are still going ahead with the Boat Gathering this year but sadly the winding hole will not be in place and neither will the landing stages. To say we are disappointed is an understatement!

However, we have now had a further meeting with Wendy Moore, a member of the LEADER team, and have discussed the feasibility of a new bid under Priority 3 "Celebrate, conserve & add value to our special culture & heritage." Basically, this would still be a bid to fund Destination South Kyme, the winding hole and water access. For this bid though additional emphasis would be on the interpretive aspect of the bid and we would be including QR codes in our display material. This would enable us to help visitors understand the role the navigation played in the prosperity of the region and encourage them to visit other linked sites such as Navigation House and Cogglesford Mill. It would also give additional information on the history of the village and possible walks in the area. Future village festivals and boat gatherings would also be part of the "celebration" element. We are currently preparing the first stage of the new bid and hope to submit it in April.
