SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

As outlined in my last report, a hardworking and dedicated Parish Council continues to work tirelessly on a range of diverse issues to improve the quality and infrastructure of the village. As promised we (South Kyme/Heckington as one voice) have written to the Secretary of State for Energy to lodge formal objections to the proposed Heckington wind farm and we now await her response. On a less grand, but no less important, scale one of the waste bins has been re-located, the main notice board will be repaired, a new Golf Club sign is in the offing and a larger container for the village hall and tidy group will be installed shortly. Furthermore, the NKDC Dog Warden is currently undertaking her training and will be actively seeking out transgressors shortly.

On the events front, the Remembrance Day service was extremely well organised and attended as was the Beer and Carols, Quiz night and Salvation Army Carol service. A big thank you goes to all who helped to organise as well as those that supported these events. My final thank you goes to the team that installed the Christmas tree in appalling weather conditions – it has never looked better!

It is the council's intention to explore the formulation of a Neighbourhood Plan, which will allow us to determine the future development and hence shape and size of the village. An NKDC planning officer will attend the next council meeting to explain some of the details and implications of such a plan. As part of the process the Local Long-Term Plan calls for an increase of no more than 17 dwellings in the village over the next 25 years and which will not extend the current curtilage.

Similarly, you will have noted my proposal to explore 'Digital Inclusion' (provision and access to the internet) which was also endorsed by the Council subject to the establishment of a formal requirement. To that end I need to know of all households within South Kyme that **DO NOT** have internet access. If this is you – then please contact me personally as without a requirement this will not go ahead.

On a broader front the next 'Cluster meeting' of villages is planned for 8 February 2016 and is being hosted by South Kyme. All local village Parish Councils will be represented, as will the Police and Highways. This is our opportunity to collectively influence local service provision. If you have any issues you want me to raise then please contact me.

As usual the Village Tidy Group continues to present the Village to a high standard but a few months off will allow them to re-energise for the New Year – new members are still required so come on and give it a try and take pride in your village.

Council spending over £100 approved by the November meeting was:

Payment of £100.89 to NKDC for administration of the May 2015 Parish Council Elections

I have been re-familiarising myself with the UK Institute of Fundraising Guidance and whilst it is a hefty tome with a variety of definitions and legal speak it nonetheless offers sound guidance for Volunteer Fundraising 'In Aid Of' (the majority of local fundraising) organised charities. It is well worth a glance for those involved but in particular 2 points require noting a) that anyone fundraising should clearly state what the event is supporting (the Charity/Cause) and b) that any funds raised should be disclosed immediately in the public domain (which provides protection from fraud or theft, protects the volunteers from accusations of dishonesty and assures donors that their donations are used for the purpose they were given). I suggest a subsequent note in the tower would cover both points adequately.

The next Parish Council Meeting and Public Forum will take place on 21 January 16 at 7.30 pm in the village hall.
