"LEST WE FORGET"



11 November 1918 signalled the end of The Great War between the Allies and Germany. Since 1921, the nation has come together to remember the sacrifices that hundreds of thousands of British and Commonwealth Service men and women made not just during the Great War, but World War II and all subsequent wars and conflicts including Iraq and Afghanistan.

We especially remember those young men from South Kyme killed in action (KIA) in The First World War, whose memorial is in the churchyard of South Kyme:

We are now well into another school year and our thoughts are turning towards Christmas.

2014-15 was again another highly successful year at school. At the end of the Reception year the % of pupils meeting, as a minimum, end of year national expectations in reading, writing and number continues to be above the national average. Data for the end of Year 2 (Key Stage 1) in 2015 shows attainment

continuing to improve to being above the national average. At the end of Year 6, the % of pupils making expected progress is in line with or above national expectations. The % of pupils exceeding expected progress continues to improve and is significantly high in reading.

We have a busy term ahead of us with regard to sporting activities. We are taking part in the Friday Festival events organised by Carres Outreach. Our cluster of primary schools (20 in total) have been divided into different groups. This half term we are competing in Dodgeball, Water Polo, Rowing and Cycling. The school were successful in achieving the Youth Sports Trust Silver Quality Mark and the Sainsbury's School Games Silver Award in 2015.

If your child was born between 01/09/11 and 31/08/12 then he/she is eligible to start school in September 2016. The admissions scheme is co-ordinated by the Local Authority (LA) Schools Admission Team and not the school. Applications online can be made at <u>www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> or over the phone by telephoning the Schools Admission Team on 01522 782030. Applications cannot be made until the 16th November 2015. Applications must be received by the School Admissions Team by noon on the 15th January 2016. We will be holding an open day event in school on the 4th November from 2pm.

I would like to thank everyone for their ongoing support and we look forward to building on our successes this school year.

SOUTH KYME PARISH COUNCIL

Work continues unabated in the background to improve the quality of life within all areas of the village and a now fully subscribed Parish Council has worked hard at making progress across a range of issues that require attention. In particular, work on the local highways is making slow but measurable headway and although we have to battle against limited County Council budgets and area wide priorities, visible improvements are being made. Patience and understanding of the bigger picture is not always easy but it is a reality budgets across government and council departments are hard pressed.

A constant gripe from all parish councillors and residents alike, is dog fouling not only along the river bank, but in other areas too. Given the number of dog bins provided and requests for dog owners to clean up, it is rather disappointing that a small number of selfish individuals continue to spoil the riverbank walk for the majority. It is also a criminal offence punishable by a large fine – up to £1000. With this in mind and the new Dog Warden about to take up her post we will now be looking to catch the culprits and impose the most severe penalties for anyone not clearing up after their dog(s).

Many of you will have noticed the Speed Indicator Device which we share on a monthly basis with North Kyme. This seems to be working in slowing down the majority of traffic but will never solve the problem entirely Whilst many of us would like a speed camera (or stingers!), this is not going to happen in the near term. The police are kept informed and continue to monitor the situation. Other issues that the parish council has been working on are:

- A. Relocation of one of the waste bins to a position next to the picnic tables.
- B. The provision of a larger storage container for the village tidy group.
- C. Repair of the village notice board and new sign for the golf club.

Another note of thanks is due to the 'village tidy group' who continue to do a sterling job in presenting our village at a very high standard. As ever, they are always short of volunteers so please go along and help for a few hours on the last Saturday of every month.

Council spending over £100 approved at the September meeting was:

£1500 for a new storage container for the village tidy group grass cutting equipment.

£212.60 for emptying of Dog Waste Bins.

NKDC's Plan for 2015-18 includes (in item 6) under Communities, an 'ambition' to promote Digital Inclusion' for all residents in North Kesteven - this means providing access to the internet. This is particularly important in rural areas where not all residents may have easy access to the internet. Whilst details are still scant this is one area in which my interest has been triggered and it is something which I hope, should there be an established requirement, that we might be able to look at in the future for South Kyme.

The next parish council meeting and public forum will be at 7.30 p.m. on Thursday19 November. Finally, we at the Council would like to wish everyone a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year. Please do come along and support all the events occurring over the festive season.

Speeding through the village is still a problem but as we only get a token Police presence with the radar gun, I don't see an end to the problem. It does seem strange that as we approach shift change time at a local factory, Police presence vanishes - strange thing that!!

I feel we can be very upbeat about our village and I feel that with a bit more thought and help we can overcome small problems and be proud to live here. Over the past year there have been many changes within the village. Some people have moved away and new people have moved in. I am sure we welcome these new folk in and hope that they will join in with all that takes place within the village. There have been some sad sides to village life too and I would like to think our thoughts go out to all who have lost family and friends in recent times.

Last year for what was the first time ever so I am led to believe, we had a ceremony at the War Memorial in the Church grounds on the 11 November to honour our war dead. There will be a ceremony again this year on Wednesday 11 November at 11.00 a.m. All are welcome and afterwards, refreshments will be on sale at the Hume, as it is also the Hume coffee morning.
